

Hours Of Devotion: Fanny Neuda's Book Of Prayers For Jewish Women



Synopsis

Written in the nineteenth century, rediscovered in the twenty-first, timeless in its wisdom and beauty, Hours of Devotion by Fanny Neuda, (the daughter of a Moravian rabbi), was the first full-length book of Jewish prayers written by a woman for women. In her moving introduction to this volume--the first edition of Neudaâ™s prayer book to appear in English for more than a century--editor Dinah Berland describes her serendipitous discovery of Hours of Devotion in a Los Angeles used bookstore. She had been estranged from her son for eleven years, and the prayers she found in the book provided immediate comfort, giving her the feeling that someone understood both her pain and her hope. Eventually, these prayers would also lead her back to Jewish study and toward a deeper practice of her Judaism. Originally published in German, Fanny Neudaâ™s popular prayer book was reprinted more than two dozen times in German and appeared in Yiddish and English editions between 1855 and 1918. Working with a translator, Berland has carefully brought the prayers into modern English and set them into verse to fully realize their poetry. Many of these eighty-eight prayers, as well as Neudaâ™s own preface and afterword, appear here in English for the first time, opening a window to a Jewish womanâ™s life in Central Europe during the Enlightenment.

For Berland, Hours of Devotion served as a guide and a testament to the mystery and power of prayer. Fanny Neudaâ™s remarkable spirit and faith in God, displayed throughout these heartfelt prayers, now offer the same hope of guidance to others.

Hours of Devotion: Fanny Neuday's Book of Prayers for Jewish Women, edited by Dinah Berland, was recommended to me by a good friend. When it arrived from , I discovered it to be a remarkable collaboration of two gifted and spiritual women living more than a century and a half and an ocean apart. In Dinah Berland's heartfelt "Editor's Preface," she tells the story of her happening on a 1937 copy of Fanny Neuda's prayer book (without the author's name) in a used book store near her home. The powerful impact these prayers had on Dinah Berland's personal life led her to rediscover the power of prayer, restore a broken relationship with her beloved son and revive her faith. It also started her on a journey to find the author and the story behind the prayers and eventually to edit and publish this 2007 edition.Berland's skills and talents as a both a published poet and a

professional editor were put to good use in creating this edition of Fanny's prayers for a new generation of women. Careful attention was given by Berland to ensure accurate translations of the prayers from the original German to English and prayers omitted in previous editions were reintroduced. The language was given a 21st century makeover to reflect common usage and gender inclusion, and a major enhancement was made to this edition by Berland setting the formerly prose constructed prayers into verse. They are so beautiful in verse! The prayers drew me in with their loving images in the prayers of God (e.g. All Compassionate One, Creator and Sustainer, Parent of All) and the language of appreciation for the beauty of the natural world they contain. Neuda saw the loving hand of God in every moment and every possible circumstance of a woman's life, and these prayers encompasses every aspect of daily life, holidays and special situations unique to a women's lives. The calming and reassuring language of the prayers give a sense of hope and peace that is hard to find in our troubled and turbulent times. I purchased a second copy to give to a friend and plan to purchase yet one more for another friend who I know will also feel as I do about these very special prayers. Thank you, Dinah Berland, for the sensitivity, skill and passion you have invested to make these beautiful poems available to a new generation of women!

This is an outstanding book written and translated by Dinah Berland. Ms Berland's introductory pages are informative and loving. It seems true that "there are no accidents". Dinah Berland discovered an old copy of this book in a low moment of her life, and rescued it from oblivion, just as it rescued her from crisis. The prayers, while written in the 19th century, are simple, eloquent and heartfelt, and ring true. Ms. Berland has provided a fascinating context for the prayers, with biographical information about Fanny Neuda and autobiographical reflections about her own spiritual journey. Best of all, she has revived a treasure that was once beloved by generations of women, and was almost lost to us.

I love the book, but I think should be clearer about the condition of their "bargain" books. There were creases on some of the pages inside, the top of a few look like they'd been cut, the dust jacket was creased and damaged in places, and it looks like it's been sitting on someone's shelf for awhile. If I was selling this used, I'd classify the condition as only fair. Because of the price, I don't think it's worth returning, but I was disappointed when I saw the condition it was in when I received it.

This prayer book is one that really touches the heart, and helps give words to us when we need them the most. I like the set up of this book as it has separate prayers for different days, life events, morning, and evening. So often when we pray, when we really need to we may be at a loss for words, this book helps to provide the words that are needed. I highly recommend this book if you are going through a difficult time, or even if you desire a book to assist you in your prayers.
