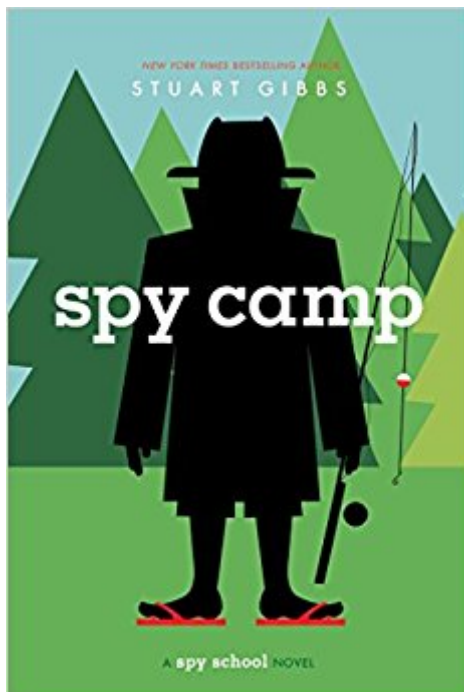

This one finds himâ”to his disgustâ”required to attend summer spy camp. Dreary, yes? But then something astonishing happens; he is approached by an agent of the supersecret evil organization Spyder, which is trying to recruit him to join the dark side. It seems Spyder hopes to capitalize on a unique talent that Ben doesnâ”™t even know he possesses. Whatâ”™s going on here?
