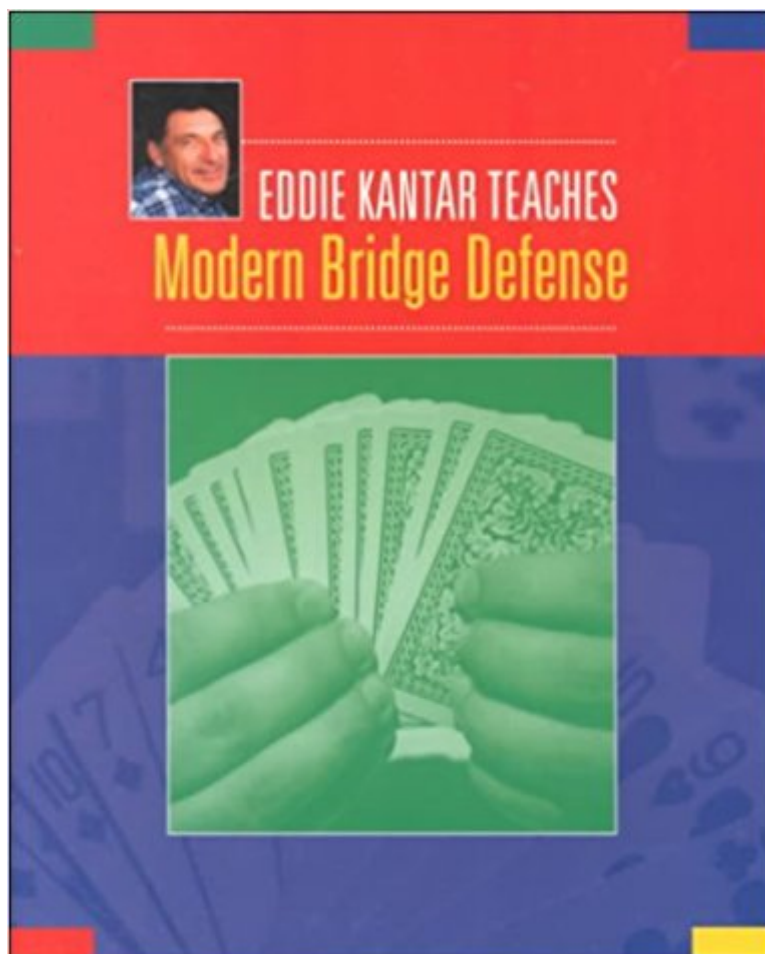

In 1974, Eddie Kantar wrote *Defensive Bridge Play Complete* (Wilshire Books), a book which has only recently gone out-of-print, and is a consensus nominee as one of the ten top bridge books ever written. So, when I encountered "jack denies" and "the standard lead is the 10, however I suggest that you lead the 9." I wished Kantar had left the non-standard defense for a later chapter. I really need a book about standard defense, not stuff that needs a special partnership agreement.
