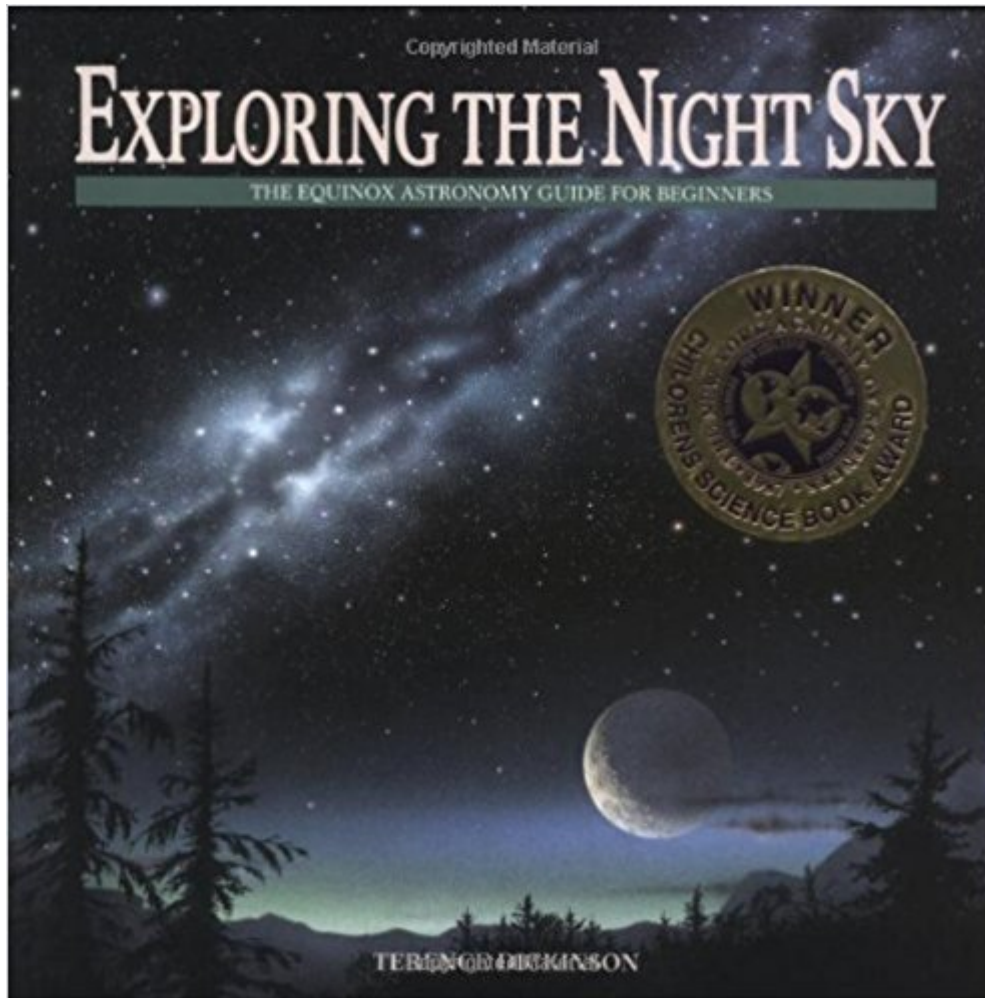

With clarity and enthusiasm, Dickinson presents a look at the high frontier, combining a "universe in 40 jumps" sort of tourtaking readers from the Moon (1.3 light-seconds) to the galactic field in general (300 million light-years) with a quick spin about the solar system, adding season-by-season charts of the salient planets, stars, and constellations visible from North America. Dozens of color paintings and some photographs accompany the text, and there is a page of advice on choosing and using binoculars and telescopes. The information is readily available elsewhere, but not so engagingly presented. Thus this is a good additional purchase for heavily-used astronomy collections.
