

The book chronicles the unit's defensive activities in the Carolina coastal regions and the battlefield actions at Seven Days, Antietam, Fredericksburg, Plymouth, Richmond and Petersburg. In addition, casualty and desertion statistics are included, along with a complete regimental roster and 118 photos, illustrations, and maps.

I have read more regimental histories than I can count or remember. These histories usually focus on a few interesting battles or people with some, very often many, gaps in the history of any particular regiment. Of all the regiments I've researched the 25th North Carolina is the one I consider my home regiment. My GGGF Williamson Garren and my GGF Joseph Youngblood were both members. Carroll Jones' book THE 25TH NORTH CAROLINA TROOPS IN THE CIVIL WAR, is the best of the best. As an author myself I know how difficult it is to research and document accurate history of a regiment.
