

PreSchool-Kâ "On this unusual day, Fox notices that different animals are passing him by, two by two. Readers will be as curious as the fox and wonder where all the animals are going until they realize that Noah is welcoming them all to the ark. The story ends as the rain begins to fall. Reid's illustrations, created from Plasticine clay carved and pressed onto illustration board, are stronger than the rhymed, pedestrian text. Intricately carved details on the fox's fur, as well as the porcupines' quills and the birds' feathers, show up sharply. The use of varying perspectives, such as from the tops of houses and the maze of the streets, allows readers to pause and take in the big picture. The spread showing the wide variety of animals sleeping peacefully together extends the metaphor. Text font is large and vocabulary is simple enough for beginning readers. This is a good supplemental purchase for libraries or religious groups needing an additional version of this

We adore this book. My son received it as a gift when he was about 15 months and we've been reading it regularly for the last two years. We purchased another for his preschool book exchange. The book is about Noah's Ark, but you really wouldn't notice that until the last page when they arrive at the ark and it says "As the rain began to fall, Noah welcomed them one and all...". It's great for religious and non-religious, and the rhyming and story flow are excellent. This is now one of my top 10 favorite children's books. I love how the ravens follow and give commentary on the fox, but the illustrations are some of the best I've seen in a kids book.

Fox wakes one morning feeling that "there was something in the air." He notices pairs of animals

marching by in a hurry and joins the procession without quite knowing why. After a long journey, including a night when "tooth and claw and fur and feather...lay down to sleep together" and a detour to free a pair of caged doves in an abandoned city, fox finds a she-fox waiting for him and they enter Noah's Ark together. The rhyming text is serviceable, although there are few awkward moments as in the forced rhyming of "thought" and "not" and the sudden shifts from couplets to monorhyme. The internal logic is a little shaky as well: it's odd that all the other animals, including the female fox, know what is going on while the fox does not. Noah's appearance at the end of the story is a surprise to the fox, and the significance of the ark is not explained in the text. Reid has supplied a springboard from which the religious content can be supplied by readers who bring their own background knowledge with them. This book is best used as a supplement to more Torah-traditional retellings, rather than as an introduction to the Noah story. Despite the weaknesses of the text, Barbara Reid's signature plasticine art elevates this book to a "must have" level. The bright colors, the variations in texture, the intricate detail, the changes in perspective, and the touches of silent humor all make this a book to pore over again and again. For ages 4 - 8.
