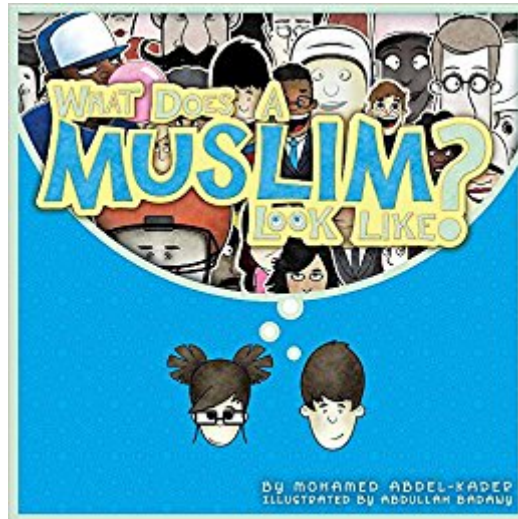

This book is a great introduction to the diversity of Muslims. The illustrations and the text are both easy to follow along and absolutely adorable! I plan on reading it to my niece as she grows up for years to come.

This book is excellent and I would highly recommend it. I read it to my daughter last night. She is almost 3 years old and she loved repeating the words with me - especially rhyming ones. She loved the rhymes - what kid doesn't? The illustrations are fantastic. My daughter found interest in very small details in the picture and asked the most random questions ("Why are they sitting on his hair?" "why is his tongue like that?"). There is a lot of detail in the words and in the illustrations that can foster a great discussion with your child. In addition, I think this book would be a great addition to most schools as there is a great lesson on diversity and tolerance in it. This book is extremely

relevant in this day and age - for readers of all ages!
