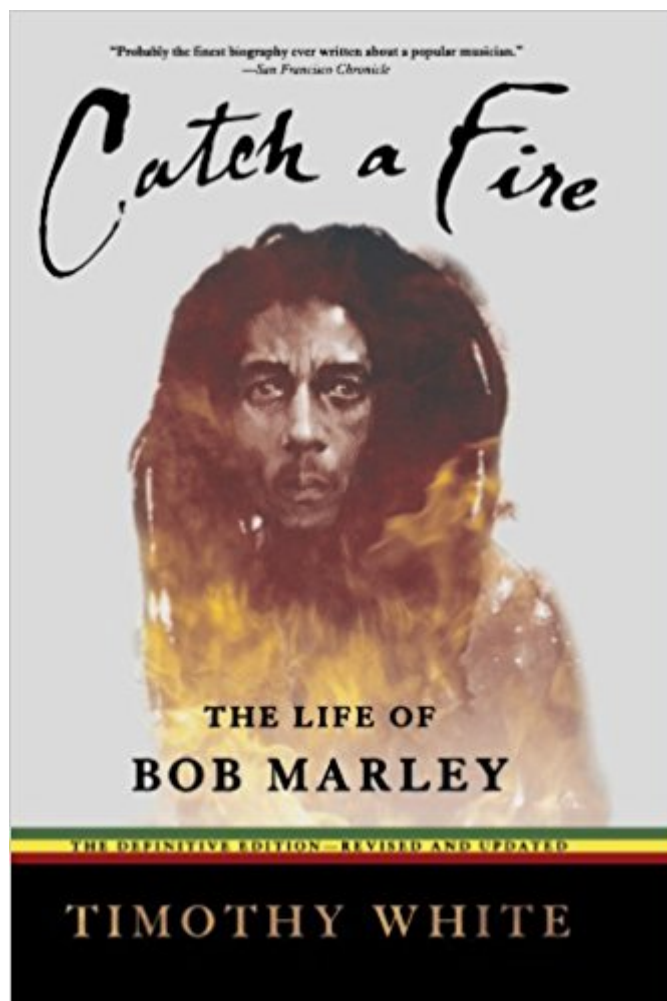

One of the most prominent music journalists of the twentieth century, Timothy White wrote extensively on Marley, reggae, and Caribbean music and culture for Rolling Stone, The New York Times, and other leading publications. His close contact with Marley and his family and inner circle of friends led to White being granted access to private papers, photographs, and memorabilia. White died in 2002.

Ever take a college course because it sounded so interesting and wild in the syllabus and when the time comes to start the actual class you immediately have buyer's remorse? Everyone loves Bob Marley. And surely a 500-page book on Marley is going to be nothing but an amazing experience to learn every nook and cranny related to his life. But you realize the author must've done so much research and had no many notes and interviews and tidbits and facts that he just figured he'd cram them into the book and no one would notice that Bob Marley wouldn't really appear until about page 100 and die a little past page 300. The rest is dense and plodding and felt like homework to get through all the aspects of religion and politics and the economy and... (you get the point, I think) The book is fascinating and you can't help but learn a lot about Bob Marley (who knew he lived in the United States and had a series of menial jobs before making it big?!) but I think the Marley doc from 2012 does just as good a job at a fraction of the time. "Faith in Jah got Marley in touch with his conscience, and faith in himself set him on a course so unlikely and so edifying that no soul around the main remained unmoved by the dimensions and lessons of Bob's self-realization."

as a fan of Bob Marley's I was interested in learning about his life and relationships; what inspired him to write certain songs, etc. Instead, I got a well documented look at the legal wrangling, the murders and exhaustive commentary on Jamaica's socio-economic standing. After I read it I didn't feel as though I knew the real Bob Marley -- but I got a hell of a history lesson!

White wrote a very thorough book about Jamaica and Jamaican music. The Jamaica that Bob Marley grew up in. He provides a detailed account of the Jamaican culture before and during Bob Marley's rise to success. White also chronicles the unfortunate hangers-on that accumulated with Bob's success and blemished his later years. The songs I have been listening to by Bob Marley for the last 20 years now have new meaning after reading this book. Initially, I thought a song was about this or that, but with some background into Marley's tribulations at the time the song was written, that particular song has a whole new meaning. For a true Bob Marley fanatic such as

myself, read this book if you want to know him from his boyhood to a man as well as the musician that broke barriers that were firmly positioned.

This book is more than just a biography of the late Bob Marley. It has a lot to offer the reader. Jamaican history and the history of the Rastafarian religion are covered in detail. It's also a ghost story, where as the author tells us how the believe in the supernatural, influences everyday Jamaican life. Marley, of course is the central character in the narrative. The other characters are highly interesting also. Bob's mother and father (the word father is used loosely) are central characters of the story, as are the member of the Wailers and his faithful wife, Rita. Very rewarding for painting a portrait of the artist. The only thing that was lacking was more color about the ten most interesting years of Bob's life when he was recording for Island! There are less than a hundred pages devoted to this period of Bob's life but more than a hundred devoted to the irrelevant BS that happened after he died. The most important time of his life was certainly glossed over.
