

I have studied this book extensively anticipating our trip in October 2013. I love that it has a pocket containing a map as well as a map in the fold-out cover of the book. As a 2011 edition I expect to experience a bit of change, but hopefully not too much. The chapters/categories are very usable and I love that it includes a time estimation for getting to various attractions by foot. Many bulleted maps are included which should help to plan. It's full of colored pictures, history, information of significance. The tram and Metro are included on the maps. The book is pocket-sized and plasticized for wear and tear. Can't wait to put it to full use!

Ok, So love the day by day series and I own them for many many cities in the world. My review is NOT for the product itself, but for the seller that shipped the item to me with 80 pages missing.

We were in Prague only 3 days - far too short. We could have used more time to really see and enjoy Prague. That was our fault. Had we know what a true jewel Prague is, we would have budgets another day or so as least as this quickly became one of our favorite European cities. We had a bit of trouble on the Czech spellings in the maps, but really had no trouble finding our wey around. Hope to go back and use the book again.

We used this and another guide book to assist us in our 4 day trip to Prague and the Sedlec Ossuary. The maps were excellent and it helped us determine how best to allot our precious time. Prague was packed with things to see and do. We were glad to catch a show at the Opera house so

we could see the grand interior.

I personally love the day by day travel book series. It is easy to read and useful to plan the trip. As some other travel books are written in long paragraph without any pictures so you really don't know if you should go to that scenic place or not.

The most important criteria in a guide book is that it be accurate, and the next is that it have lots of useful information without being too overwhelming. This one meet those criteria. I used it one for Berlin and this one for Prague on the same trip. Berlin better lends itself to the day-by-day guides than the Prague itineraries, but it was still very useful and easy to follow.

There are so many tourists in Prague these days that the only solution to actually enjoying your visit is to follow the smaller streets, and yet not get lost. Special categories: gardens, markets, historical areas and more...

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
