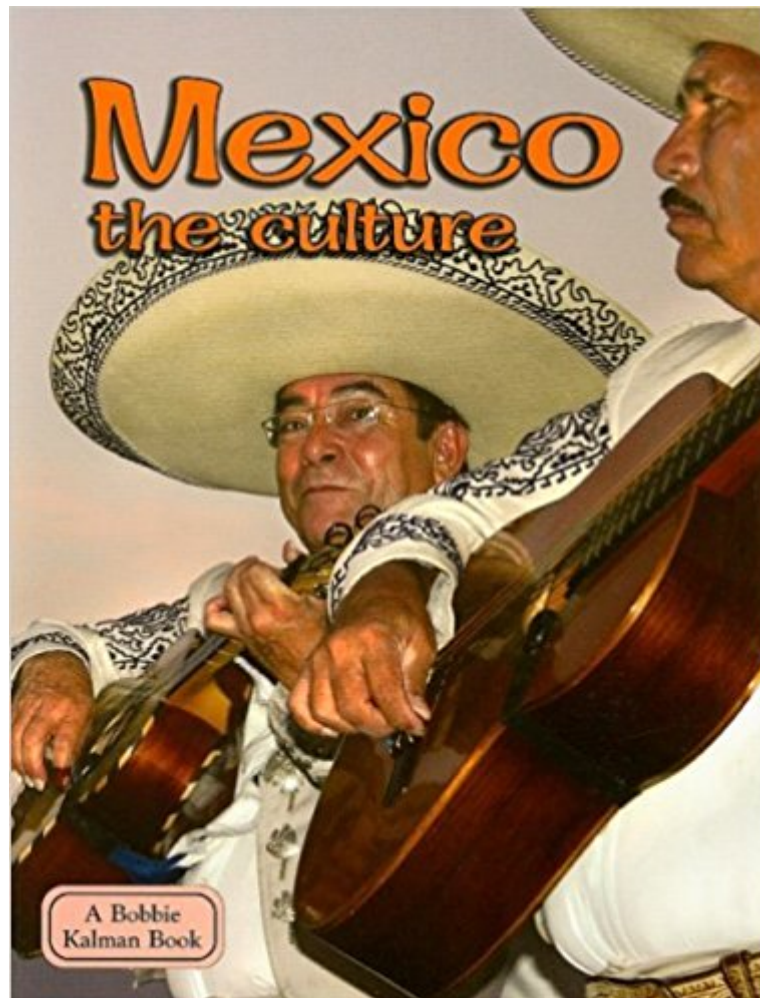




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Mexico The Culture (Lands, Peoples, & Cultures (Paperback))

Grade 3-5-There are some changes in these updated versions of the 1993 titles-increases in population, highways and railroad tracks are noted, and many pictures have been replaced-but the revisions are not significant. Culture highlights the arts, music, dance, legends, holidays, cooking, sports, and language. Land is a mixed bag-true to its title, it delves into geography, earthquakes, volcanoes, and resources, but it also speaks of illegal immigration into the U.S. and problems between the rich and the poor. People focuses on aspects of daily lives. There is overlap among the books-all three have very similar sections on Mexico's ancient cultures. Culture and People have some repetition dealing with religion and holidays. Nevertheless, the photos are bright and clear, the texts are readable, and the length of the books makes them a less formidable resource for research projects than many reference books. The books provide a good mix of geography, history, scenery, customs, food, religious holidays, music, food, etc. Good photos, and the writing is strong enough to be of interest to adults but not so heavy that it chases away middle school or high school readers. I also really like the selection of countries. The series includes some of the biggest and best known countries (major European countries like England, Spain, and Italy; China; Brazil; etc.) but it also includes lesser known countries like El Salvador.
