

Robin C. Brown grew up in Tampa and received his bachelor and M.D. degrees from Tulane University. He practiced medicine in Fort Myers for thirty-six years. His lifelong interest in the early history of the state prompted writing Florida's Fossils. He also wrote Florida's First People, an authoritative study of the Paleoindians. His most recent book, The Crafts of Florida's First People, describes the skills that pre-contact Florida people needed to survive and how people today can

master those same skills.

This book is great. I've read a lot of good Florida fossil books, but this one is my favorite because it has a timeline of events that puts not only the ancient fossils in perspective by time, but a good explanation of FL's geology and development in relation to the existence of ancient life. It is easy to understand. I was confused not knowing the epochs and when man appeared or when anything appeared, etc. The charts and illustrations were very helpful in understanding what, when and where these ancient creatures existed. So when you find a fossil, you can understand what you are looking at, what to hunt for, and when it might have been alive and why it was in that particular area. The book also shows you where you can go to hunt for fossils. The pictures of the animals are very helpful too. If you are interested in some of the ancient shells, it covers a bit about them also. I'm giving one of these books to a friend who also loves to hunt for fossils. It's a nice sized hardback book too. Good book for your FL library. If you are a Floridian - this book will make you appreciate it more than just being a tourist attraction.

The included maps and directions to fossil hot spots, and the contact information for fossil groups made this book even more of a 'find' than I thought it was going to be. This book provides a well-rounded introduction for anyone who wishes to collect fossils in Florida and doesn't want to or can't collect in the typical tourist areas. The author writes to someone that has never collected in Florida, developing the geology, with clear diagrams and photographs of some fossils that could be found.
